

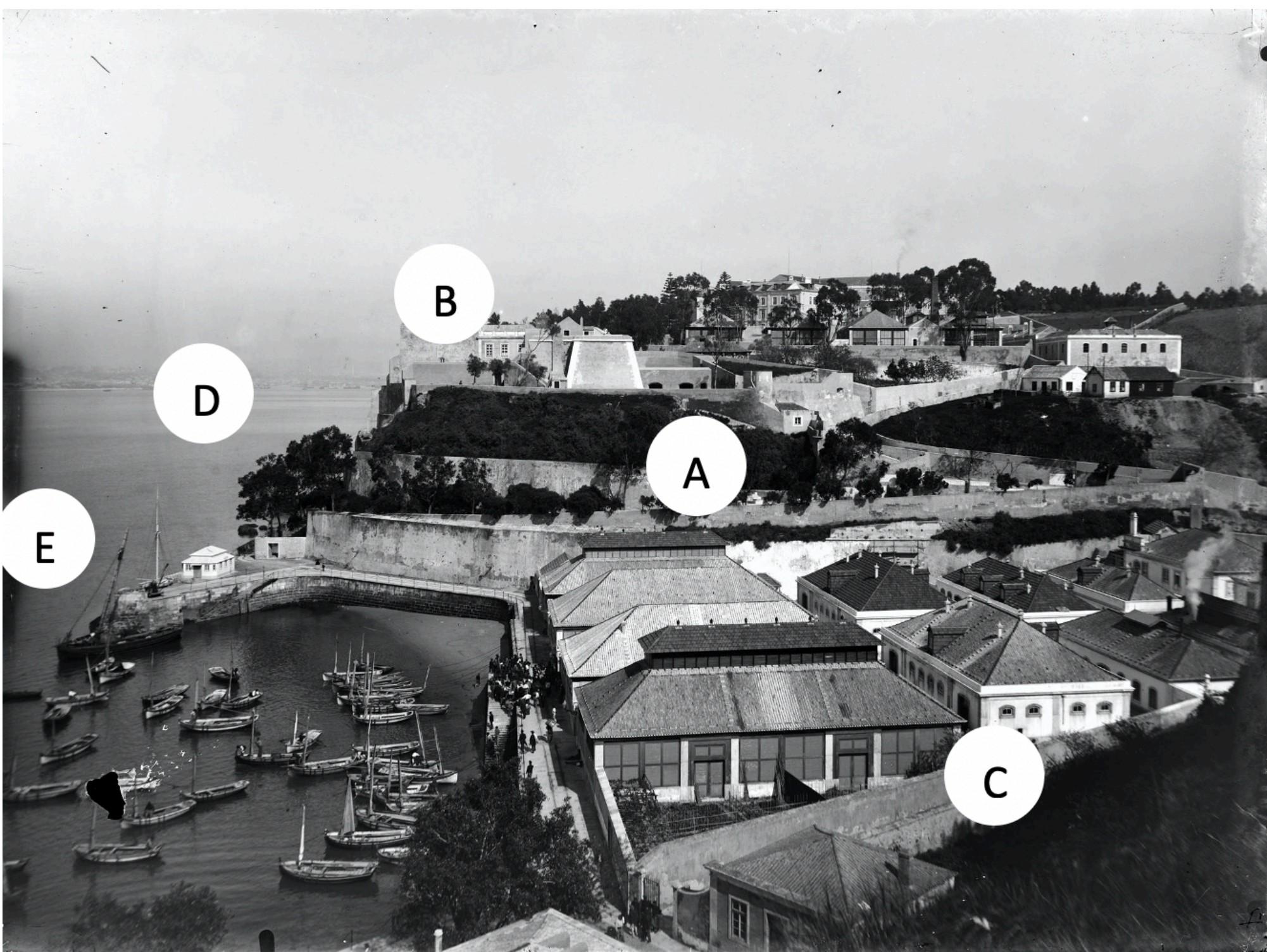

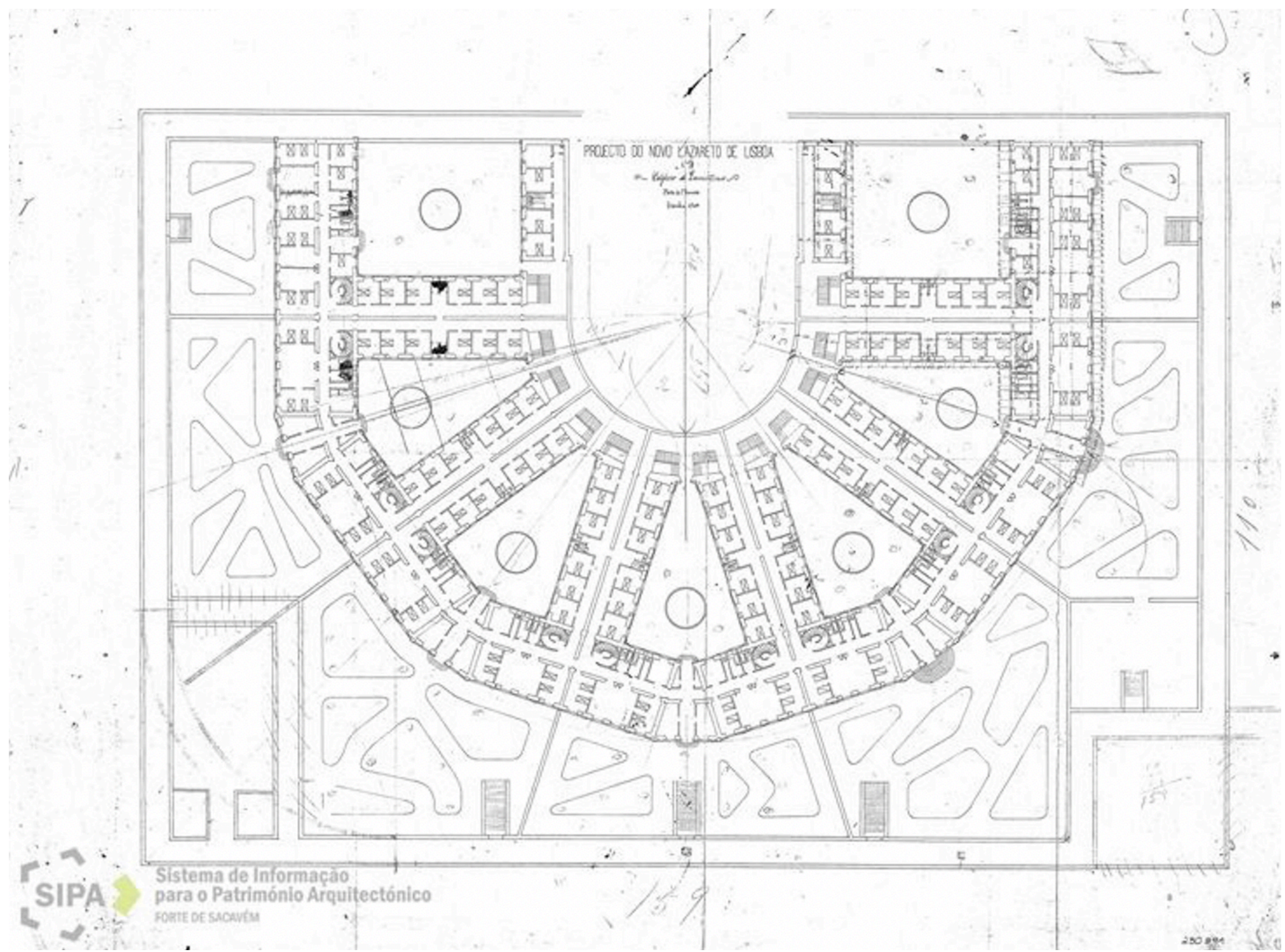

Within the urban requalification of Lisbon, a new and particular Lisbon Lazaretto was built on the southern side of the Tagus river, from 1861 until 1869. It was its unique architecture alongside with up-to-date scientific equipment and instruments that allowed the city to build a barrier to avoid disease's spreading.
